
In Memory of

Tino grew up in Terlingua working on his father's ranch alongside all his brothers and sisters. Later, Tino served his country with honor in the U.S. Army during World War II. He was part of the 29th Infantry Division and was stationed in Germany. Tino fought alongside his fellow soldiers in the Battle of the Bulge. Also, he was a recipient of the Purple Heart.
